## A Note From Our Editor

Welcome to *CINEMANIA!* (*Southeast Michigan*)!

The genesis of this project came from our tight-knit movie night crew desiring to network with other film enthusiasts to share resources and promotion. I found that there was no solid general source for cinematic happenings in the area, and that even the websites for some of the theaters are difficult to navigate. This should be a pretty good overview of the special screenings happening at the usual places, with preference given to movie screenings that are FREE, FOREIGN, OLD, or on FILM. Basically, I am picking out screenings that I would attend if all I did was go to see movies.

I have wanted to publish a periodical in this format since late 2005, when I printed up a test issue that focused more on DIY music events. I never followed through with making it a regular thing (I wanted to do it weekly), but it has stayed in the back of my mind since then.

Last month, I made a proof-of-concept issue zero of this gazette with just the screenings to get the ball rolling. Dustin has done a ton of work to improve the concept to what you see here. Our goal is to improve something about the gazette each month, so that each issue is special.



Frank Uhle's book *Cinema Ann Arbor* was a big inspiration that opened up my awareness of the rich cinematic history of the city (and the UM campus in particular), in a time before smaller screens took over people's viewing habits. We think this shift over the last 20 years or so is moving in the wrong direction, and hope that *Cinemania!* will be a catalyst to encourage people to reclaim the experience of going to see films on the big screen.

Print and Cinema may be seen as dying forms, but we strongly believe there is still a lot of potential for these media.
